Who is it for?

Entry Requirements

There are no previous qualifications or age restriction for this course.

Apprentices must have:

• Have held a residency in the UK for the last three years.

• Candidates must be working and interacting daily with children in the birth to 5 age range in accordance with the EYFS, the setting must be delivering the EYFS learning and development requirements.

• Be able to complete Functional Skills Level 1 English and maths whilst on programme if previously not secured a grade 4 (C) or above in GCSE maths and English.

Funding
