Early Years Educator Level 3

What will I learn?

- Understands own role and responsibilities with safeguarding and security, including child protection, legal requirements, and confidentiality of information.
- Statutory guidance in care and education of children with special educational needs and disabilities.
- The importance to children's holistic development of communication, personal, social and emotional development, physical development and literacy and numeracy.

What skills will I develop?

- Work co-operatively with parents, colleagues, and other professionals to meet the needs of babies and children and enable them to progress.
- Plan and lead activities, purposeful play opportunities and educational programmes which include the learning and development areas of current early education curriculum requirements.

- be a reflective practitioner with a commitment to continued professional development.

Who is it for?

Suitable for someone who is already working in, or aspiring to work in Early Years Childcare.

It is a great progression route for a practitioner who already holds an Early Years Practitioner Level 2 qualification and want to pursue a career as an Early Years Educator, Nursery Teaching Assistant, Nursery Nurse, Supervisor, or Childminder.

Entry Requirements

- Held a residency in the UK for the last three years.
- Candidates must be working and interacting daily with children in the birth to 5 age range in accordance with the EYFS, the setting must be delivering the EYFS learning and <u>development</u> requirements.
- Apprentices aged 16-18 years must be able to complete Functional Skills Level 2 English and Maths whilst on programme if previously not secured a Grade 4 (C) or above in GCSE maths and English
- Apprentices aged 19+ years be able to complete Functional Skills Level 2 English whilst on programme if previously not secured a Grade 4 (C) or above in GCSE English, to be included in the staff/child ratio at level 3 under the Early Years Foundation Stage statutory framework. They have the option to also complete Functional Skills Level 2 in Maths, but this is no longer a mandatory requirement.

Funding

- £7000 for this 18-month course.
- 100% funded for those settings who pay into the Government apprenticeship Levy.
- 95% funded for non-levy setting, a 5% employer contribution of £350 per learner.
- An employer incentive payment of £1,000 is available for new apprentices aged 16 to 18 and those under 25 with an Education, Health, and Care Plan.

End Point Assessment

- Professional Discussion Supported by a portfolio of evidence.
- Observation with questioning in the workplace.
